

Dorothy Burton is Founder and President of Christians in Public Service. She is the first African American elected to the Duncanville City Council, serving four terms as Councilwoman At-Large.

Dorothy is a former board member of the National League of Cities Women in Municipal Government, the first board member elected from Texas. Former Assistant Regional Director for the National Black Caucus of Local Elected Officials; and first African American elected as Board Chair of the Dallas Central Appraisal District Board of Directors, serving two-terms.
